## Fish Stocking List for Algonquin Provincial Park — 2013 to 2018

### BROOK TROUT



Algonquin Provincial Park lakes are stocked with a native strain of Brook Trout from Dickson Lake in Algonquin.

In 2017 the park was able to take advantage of a surplus of fish, and stock all of our regularly stocked Brook Trout lakes in the park. Some lakes were stocked with older, and therefore significantly larger stock than in previous years.

Unless otherwise noted, Algonquin lakes are stocked with yearling fish (16-17 months old)

- Stocked with sub-adult immature fish (22 months old)
- Stocked with mature adult fish

### How You Can Help with Fisheries Monitoring in 2018

When registering for a camping permit you will be asked if you intend to fish during your trip; if yes, you will then be asked what species you will be fishing for. Anyone planning to fish for trout or bass will be asked to take along a voluntary survey to record the angling effort and catch for your party. The survey is a pocket-sized sheet printed on waterproof paper that takes just minutes per day to complete. At the end of your trip, the survey may be mailed to the Algonquin Fisheries Assessment Unit in the postage-paid envelope provided or returned to any Park office. Algonquin Park contains over 25 percent of native Brook Trout lakes and about 10 percent of native Lake Trout lakes remaining in Ontario. It is imperative that we monitor the condition of these irreplaceable fisheries. We thank you for helping us with this important monitoring.

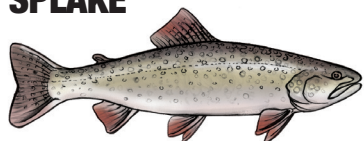

### SPLAKE



Splake are a hybrid produced by crossing female Lake Trout (Killala Lake strain) and male Brook Trout (Hill's Lake strain). They are specifically used to provide Put-Grow-Take fisheries in lakes that will not support populations of either parent fish.
